3. Key Initiatives in 2025

3.1 Access and Inclusivity

Formulating clear and focused research questions,


Crafting impactful problem statements and literature reviews,

Ensuring academic tone, coherence, and proper citation styles.






Lincoln University College Partners with STIKes Mitra Husada Medan for Undergraduate Midwifery Program

1.0 Introduction

5.0 CONCLUSION


